In **English** we will be ...

- Reading 'The Adventures of Odysseus'
- Planning and editing myths, using a range of conjunctions and direct speech
- Planning and writing an extended report about an innovated creature, in the style of 'Arthur Spiderwick's field guide to the fantastical world around you'

In **Science** we will be ...

- Naming the main parts of the human circulatory system
- Comparing different types of exercise and heart rate
- Researching the impact of tobacco on how the human body functions

In **RE** we will be ...

- Learning how Hindus show commitment to God
- Investigating puja and pilgrimage
- Learning about the Hindu way of life

In **PE** we will be ...

- Learning to play tag rugby
- Developing key skills and principles such as defending, attacking, throwing, catching, running and dodging
