


Arctic winters are long and cold while summers are short and cool
	biome	A natural area of the living world which has its own climate, vegetation and animals
	climate	The general weather conditions that are typical of a place
	Climate zone	Sections of the Earth that are divided according to climate . There are three main climate zones: polar, temperate and tropical
	continent	A very large area of land that consists of many countries. Europe is a continent .
	degrees	A unit of measurement that is used to measure angles
	equator	An imaginary line around the middle of the Earth at an equal distance from the North Pole and South Pole
	human geography	Features of land that have been impacted by human activity
	humid	A climate that is very hot and damp
	Greenwich	Borough of Greater London, England, located on the prime meridian
	latitude	Latitude of a place is its distance from the equator
	longitude	Longitude is its distance east or west of the line passing through Greenwich
	Northern hemisphere	The half of the globe lying north of the equator
	Physical geography	Natural features of land
Prime meridian	The line of longitude passing through Greenwich, England (0 degrees) from which all other lines of longitude are calculated	
Southern hemisphere	The half of the globe lying south of the equator	
temperate	A place which is never extremely hot or cold	
time zone	One of the areas of the world which is divided where the time is calculated as being a particular number of hours behind or ahead of GMT (Greenwich Mean Time)	
tropics	Parts of the world that lie between the tropic of cancer, north of the equator , and the tropic of Capricorn, south of the equator. The tropics have a humid climate.




